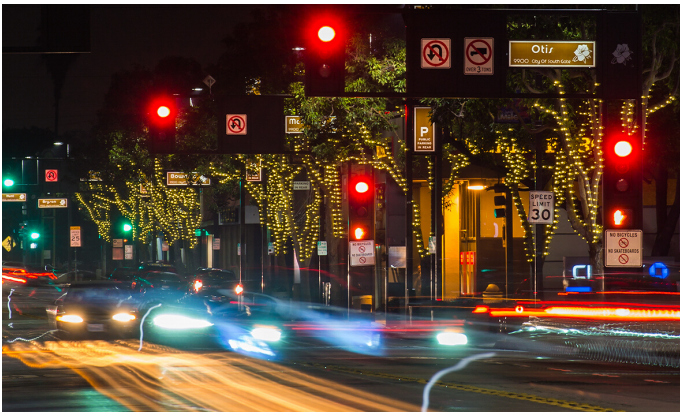

DID YOU KNOW?



Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg's childhood home was located in South Gate. Seaborg won the Noble Prize in Chemistry in 1951. He was also the first living person to have an element (Seaborgium, 106Sg) named in their honor. The City Council accepted the donation of the house and has preserved it for public purposes.

Amelia Earhart learned to fly at Kinner Field, a dirt field located on Long Beach Boulevard in South Gate. Earhart became the first woman to fly solo around the Atlantic Ocean in 1932.



Tweedy Boulevard and "Tweedy Mile" get its name after the Tweedy family. Originally from Illinois, the Tweedy family purchased 2,000 acres of land on which much of South Gate was built after moving to California in 1852.
