The City Council received a report from the City Attorney's Office concerning threatened litigation this is litigation that has not yet been filed in the court. It involved potential litigation as it involves potential contamination at a disposal facility that is now closed. There are now concerns that environmental contamination is plausible. The City Council authorized the execution of an agreement to extend the statute of limitations so that a law suit does nott have to be filed against the City or against any other potential party. There is no evidence at this time that the City has any liability in the case. On a motion made by Mayor Davila and seconded by Vice Mayor Bernal and on a vote of 5-0 the City Council authorized the execution of that agreement in order to extend the time period by any potential threatened litigation could be brought in the future.
